Entry Procedures & Department Rules

1. Please read all General Rules on page 12.
2. No artificial flowers or foliage allowed except where noted.
3. No painted fresh material allowed.
4. Flat ribbons will be available for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd places at release.

Entry Hints:

1. Cut flowers in late afternoon of the day before they are to be exhibited, place immediately in deep lukewarm water, keep out of drafts and in a dark room.
2. Select material in its prime and pest free.
3. Name varieties if possible. Visitors to the Fair want to know the names of the varieties.
4. Roses should have healthy stems at least 12' long. Two, clean, 5-leaflets must be present. Blooms should be 1/2 to 3/4 open.
5. Gladioli should have 5-7 florets open, long, stiff, straight stem and one leaf.
6. Dahlias should have no side buds and center should not show with the exception of single or collarete varieties.
7. In lots requiring three or more blooms, they should be the same size and quality.
8. In the rose classes ht-type means a single spiraled center. Informal is everything else. Most Floribundas are "informal."
9. Exhibitors are encouraged to replace cut flowers that may be perishable as often as necessary for the duration of the Fair.
10. No entry will be release or removed before Sunday, August 7, 2011- NO EXCEPTIONS.

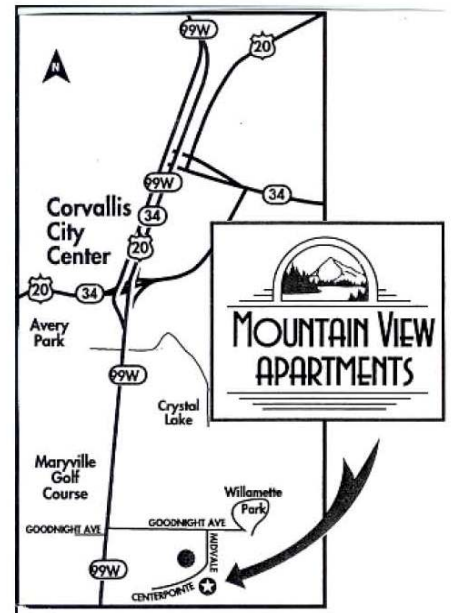

Entry Hints:

To help you select and prepare your entries, a good reference is the OSU Extension Service Bulletin "Selecting and Preparing Vegetables for Exhibit" available at the Benton County Extension Office, 1849 NW 9th St., Corvallis, OR.

1. **Trueness to type** - specimens should be typical of the variety in shape, color, and size.
2. **Quality and Condition** - specimens should be edible, in prime condition, free from blemishes or damage from insects, disease or handling. Specimens with the deepest color are preferred.
3. **Uniformity** - specimens should be alike in size, shape, color, texture, and stage of maturity.
4. **Size** - contrary to popular opinion, large entries do not have a competitive edge over other entries (except for special entries such as largest pumpkin, watermelon, or head of cabbage). Largeness suggests coarseness. Medium-sized specimens are more typical of a variety and most desired.
5. **Cleanliness** - dirt distracts from the natural attractiveness of vegetables and conveys an unfavorable impression to judges and the public. Wipe cucumbers, tomatoes, peppers, and other soft skinned vegetables with a damp cloth. Wash or lightly brush soil from potatoes, carrots, and beets. Clean leafy vegetables such as Swiss Chard by dipping in cool water.

6. **Neat arrangement in containers** - carefully align specimens to enhance their most attractive and desirable characteristics.
7. **Exhibitors are encouraged to replace items that may be perishable as often as necessary for the duration of the Fair.**
8. **No entry will be release or removed before Sunday, August 7, 2011 - NO EXCEPTIONS.**
